Dear Friends and Family of St. Michael Broadcasting,

The weekend of April 29 I attended the national meeting, held in Mundelein, Illinois, of the **Institute on Religious Life (IRL)**. At this meeting, the founder of this station, Fr. Kenneth Baker, S.J., received the *Pro Fidelitate et Virtute* (For Faithfulness and Valor) award. IRL gave Fr. Baker this award "...to express their respect for his fidelity as a Jesuit and for his dedication as a priest, theologian and Catholic journalist. Father's unwavering fidelity to the teachings of Christ helped His Church to navigate through the murky waters of renewal following the Second Vatican Council." At the award banquet, Father gave a talk called "Catholic and Proud of It." Congratulations, Father Baker!

Though I first met Father personally 3 years ago, this was the first time I learned his biographical information: He joined the Jesuits in 1947 and spent two years in novitiate. He studied Latin and Greek for two years. He studied philosophy for three years. He taught high school for three years. He took four years of theology, and in the third year of this (1960), was ordained a priest. He spent another year in the novitiate, called "tertianship," undergoing intense spiritual training. Then for two years he taught philosophy at Gonzaga in Spokane. Then he spent three more years in graduate school. Finally, in 1967, he received his Ph.D. He speaks Latin, Greek, German, Italian, and French and has a reading knowledge of Spanish. I told Father, "No wonder it seems like you know everything!"

The **Institute on Religious Life** was founded in 1974 as a response to the dramatic fall-off in vocations to the consecrated religious life. Founders included Fr. John Hardon, S.J., Blessed Mother Teresa, Most Rev. Fulton J. Sheen, Servant of God, and many others. Its purpose is to support the growth, development and renewal of consecrated life--- particularly vowed religious life--- as a gift to the entire Church and an evangelical witness to the world.

At the meeting, there were priests and sisters from everywhere. I met two sisters from North Viet Nam from the Lovers of the Sacred Heart, who are studying at Marquette. There was a new order of young, fervent sisters from Ohio called Children of Mary. There were Passionist Nuns, Poor Clares, Franciscan Handmaids of the Most Pure Heart of Mary, Canons Regular of St. John Cantius, Rosminians, Norbertine Fathers, Missionaries of the Sacred Heart, and so on. A number of the orders had very young members. It was very inspiring to see so many Priests Brothers and Sisters who, as it says in the prayer for vocations "...love Thee with their whole strength and gladly *spend their entire lives* to serve Thy

Church and to make Thee known and loved.” Like the Blessed Mother, they are giving a whole-hearted “Yes” to God. All of us, like them, in whatever our capacity: young, old, single, married--- are called to serve.

If you are like me, you don't know that most of these orders even exist, much less what they do. One of the questions that came to my mind was, “How did these people find these orders and how did these orders find these people?” We would like to devote some broadcast time to these faithful orders. If you would like to volunteer to contact these orders for informational DVDs that we could play, please contact the station.

We need your help! Many of our listeners write in, saying they are glad the station exists because they've never seen anything like it before. Programs like *Maafa 21*, *Demographic Bomb*, Fr. Barron, *Stop Planned Parenthood*, Msgr. Smith's series on Moral Theology etc., are simply not available elsewhere. We continue to operate at a loss. My Mission in Life by John Henry Cardinal Newman (1848)

God knows me and calls me by my name.... God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission—I never may know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. Somehow I am necessary for His purposes... I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling. Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; In perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; If I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. My sickness, or perplexity, or sorrow may be necessary causes of some great end, which is quite beyond us. He does nothing in vain; He may prolong my life, He may shorten it; He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends, He may throw me among strangers, He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide the future from me— still He knows what He is about.... Let me be Thy blind instrument. I ask not to see— I ask not to know—I ask simply to be used.

Is it possible to receive Channel 16 if you have cable? Yes!

You may need these items:

Antenna (UHF) outdoor is better than indoor (cost: \$3-\$53 indoor, \$50-\$130 outdoor)

A-B Switch (cost: \$5-\$18)

Coaxial cable 3'-6' or more (cost: \$3-\$11)

Converter box (Cost: \$50-\$60)

Instructions for a digital TV:

Plug cable TV cable into "A" side of A-B switch.

Connect coax cable to "Out to TV" on the A-B switch.

Plug other end of the coax cable into "Cable/Antenna IN" on the back of TV.

Make sure your cable channels work. If they don't, flip the switch on the A-B switch.

Once cable is coming in, flip switch on the A-B switch. You should now receive no cable channels.

Plug antenna into "B" side of A-B switch.

Go into MENU on channel changer. Go to "external inputs" and click to "cable off," or "antenna," or "standard." Then go to "Channels" and press "scan" or "auto program."

You should now be able to receive channel 16. To go back and forth between cable and antenna reception, go to the MENU and switch between cable and antenna reception.

Instructions for an analog TV:

Plug cable TV cable into "A" side of A-B switch.

Connect coax cable to "Out to TV" on the A-B switch

Plug other end of the coax cable into "Cable/Antenna IN" on the back of TV

Make sure your cable channels work. If they don't, flip the switch on the A-B switch.

Once cable is coming in, flip switch on the A-B switch. You should now receive no cable channels.

Plug antenna into converter box, and the converter box into "B" side of A-B switch.

Set TV to Channel 3 and PUT THIS (TV) CHANNEL CHANGER ASIDE.

Get channel changer for converter box. Go to MENU and scan for channels. 16 should come in. To go back to cable reception, flip the A-B switch. When you want to go back to antenna reception, set the channel to 3 using the TV channel changer, flip the A-B switch, and then control channels using the converter box channel changer.

Other helpful suggestions: Regarding antennas, outdoor is better than indoor. Higher up in the house, such as rooftop or attic (even higher in a room), is better than lower (basement) We broadcast from the top of the IDS, so you want the most unobstructed shot (e.g. near a window, no trees) between your antenna and the IDS that you can get. Stucco houses (enclosed in wire mesh), thick or multiple walls and basements impair your ability to receive Channel 16. The "bow-tie" Digitenna DUV-1 antenna (cost \$30) is a good indoor antenna, but others are available. We found the above listed components at Radio Shack, Best Buy and Wal-Mart, though Wal-Mart doesn't have A-B switches. The highest prices were Radio Shack, the lowest were from wholesaler Ness Electronics, 651-251-5700, located at 2135 Energy Park Drive, St. Paul, MN 55108. However, **you need to ask about their return policy!** You may want to look in your Yellow Pages under Television-Service & Parts for a smaller retailer near you who would accept returns. We are told Plaza TV, East Lake TV and Golden Valley TV might have these components, but there are many others. For outdoor antenna sales and installation locally, you might call Robin TV 763-533-1566, or Robert Paul Installation 651-271-6819. Stillwater area: Johnny's TV, 651-439-5965; Elk River: Minnesota Electronics, 320-251-2951; LeSeuer: Butch Ward TV, 507-665-6900; Cannon Falls: GS Antenna 507-775-2548; Faribault: DeGroot TV: 507-332-7495. We are not recommending these businesses; we just know they sell and install.

Instructions for an older (analog) TV with no cable:

You need an antenna and a converter box. Aim your antenna at the IDS. Set TV to channel 3. Put that channel changer aside. Using the converter box channel changer, go to the menu and scan for channels.
